❑ **Bus Service: The T**

What services does The T (Fort Worth Transportation Authority) offer?

- Regular city bus service is available on routes that operate from 5 a.m. to midnight, Monday - Friday, and from 6 a.m. to midnight on Saturday. Sunday service is reduced coverage.
- Express routes allow virtually non-stop travel weekdays from designated Park & Ride lots to downtown Fort Worth. For route and schedule information call (817) 215-8600.
- If you are in downtown Fort Worth, you can ride The T's regular buses to lunch, shopping or business meetings for free! Henderson, Jones, Belknap and Lancaster bound The T's Downtown Free Zone.
- During the Summer, Safari trolleys serve the Fort Worth Zoo. On Saturdays, you can ride a trolley to the historic Stockyards area.
- The T's Rider Request routes serve riders in the Richland Hills Area. Within the Rider Request service areas, you may have a bus meet you where and when you like by making a reservation in advance. Call (817) 215-8600 for additional information.

What does it cost to ride the bus?

You may view a complete fare listing at www.the-t.com. Basic one-way fares are:

- Adult are \$1.50
- Child/student ages 5 through 18 are 75¢
- Senior citizen/disabled are 75¢

What is Vanpooling?

The T's Customer Service Department coordinates vanpools all over Fort Worth. A vanpool is a group of at least seven people who share the costs (van lease, insurance, maintenance and in some cases fuel) of getting to and from work. These individuals usually live and work near one another. Generally, vanpools have a primary driver and an alternate driver.

MIT S: Mobility-Impaired Transportation Services

What is Mobility-Impaired Transportation Services (MIT S)?

With this service, persons with disabilities who have been certified through the MIT S office, may ride anywhere within Fort Worth, Richland Hills and Blue Mound. With this door-to-door service, trained drivers assist passengers in boarding and deboarding vehicles especially designed to accommodate the mobility-impaired. Rides are available any day of the week and for any purpose.

When is MIT S available?

MIT S operates on a schedule comparable to fixed route bus service and is available seven days a week.

What does it cost to ride MIT S?

A one-way fare costs \$2.75. For your convenience, you may purchase prepaid ride tickets. To order tickets by mail, call (817) 215-8600 for an envelope and order form. Online purchase are available at www.the-t.com.

Who is eligible for MIT S?

Persons with a verified disability that prevents them from riding regular city buses.

Air Transportation

Fort Worth Alliance Airport

Fort Worth Alliance Airport is a public facility located in north Fort Worth on I-35 near the Texas Motor Speedway. Owned by the City of Fort Worth and operated by Alliance Air Services, Fort Worth Alliance Airport serves the needs of industrial, corporate and general aviation. Spinks Airport

Spinks Airport serves as a general aviation airport in south Fort Worth off of I-35. It is a reliever airport for the entire Metroplex and home port for a range of aviation businesses, including aircraft maintenance, corporate aviation and air ambulance services. Spinks Airport is equipped with a 6,000-foot asphalt runway and a parallel 4,000-foot turf runway for pilot training. For more information, call (817) 447-8304.

Meacham Airport

Meacham Airport is known for its long-term association with corporate and student pilot activity, offering two parallel runways and a crosswind runway. The airport has several Fixed Base Operators who provide services including commercial aircraft modification, avionics service, aircraft painting, aircraft sales, airframe and powerplant shops, and a pilot shop. Other aircraft services include hangar rental, offices, counter spaces and meeting places. Meacham Airport is located off of I-820, just five miles north of Fort Worth's central business district, including Downtown Fort Worth and the historic Fort Worth Stockyards. ❑ D/FW Airport Service

What transportation is available to DFW airport?

- Yellow Checker Shuttle Co. provides daily transportation to and from DFW Airport under the name of the "Airporter." Boarding is available at all major downtown Fort Worth hotels and the Airporter parking lot. Other Fort Worth hotels are also serviced on demand with your advanced reservation to (817) 267- 5150.

- The Trinity Railway Express links downtown Fort Worth's T&P Station with CentrePort/DFW Airport Station Monday through Saturday. The airport's free Remote South shuttle bus service provides continuous connections between the station and airline terminals. Three shuttle bus routes link the CentrePort/DFW Airport Station and the airlines -- by way of the Remote South Parking Lot.

- To airline terminals: TRE passengers traveling from CentrePort/DFW Airport Station to airline terminals board Remote South buses on the northwest end of the rail station platform. Buses depart the station approximately every 15 minutes.
- At Remote South, passengers connect to buses serving either Terminals A and C, Terminals B and E or Terminal D.

❑ Trinity Railway Express

Is there a commuter train in the metroplex?

Yes. There is a commuter rail between Fort Worth and Dallas that goes through northeast Tarrant County. You can board the Trinity Railway Express at 10 stations. Free parking is available at six stations (no overnight parking), as well as bus and DART light rail connections at many stations.

What does a commuter train ride cost?

A day pass is valid for unlimited uses until 3 a.m. the following day.

Fares are based on zones. There are two zones:

- From the T&P Station to CentrePort/DFW Airport Station
- From the CentrePort/DFW Airport Station to Union Station

Children ages 4 and under may ride for free. Children and students ages 5 to 18 may ride for a reduced fare, as may seniors and persons with a disability.
